Time it right. Keep it short. When you do, it's cheaper to call Congressman Leo Ryan's Washington office than it is to call Senator George Moscone's or Assemblyman Lou Papan's offices in Sacramento.

Make your call to Washington before 8 a.m. Pacific time. That's no problem on the other end, because it's 11 a.m. back there. If you're the talkative type, plan your call well.

THE EARLY morning call to Washington will cost you 22 cents for one minute, 16 cents for each additional minute.

Since it costs Pacificans 15 cents to call Ryan's San Mateo office, that 22 cents is a real bargain.

When you're calling Papan's Sacramento office, on the other hand, you have to call during the "high-rent" hours—8 to 5—so it's going to cost 55 cents. But you get three minutes to talk.
